He provides a strong presence for us in the midfield and we really missed his ability to win the ball and his energy. Perhaps I have to shoulder some blame as I altered our goalkeeping strategy and threw Jake in to goals at the last minute when he had absolutely no preparation. Despite that, Jake did a solid job with one memorable one-on-one save – none of the goals were Jake's fault. I know it sounds odd, but the teams were fairly level in ability and the scoreline is misleading – they just had more fight in them and also weren't paying much credit to the spirit of the offside rule ie. they weren't obeying it at all.



We have the potential to be a good side if we take on to the field the skills we practice but the team is not doing that at present and until we do, we will struggle. There were some opportunities for us to lead in the first half but Andrew was fouled three times in a row in one-on-one situations and there's not much you can do about that at U9 level. Had he scored and we lead at half-time, perhaps the boys might have lifted.

As coach, I am really not concerned about the scoreline but rather the way we are trying to play and, at the moment, the work we are doing at practice just isn't sinking in.

Once it does, the team will score more goals and concede less – much more enjoyable for all of us parents on the sideline 😊
