Class 1440 Fresh Culinary Herbs, 6

Exhibit six stems or comparable quantity of one variety of a **fresh** herb exhibited in a disposable container of water. Herbs include but are not limited to: basil, dill, parsley. Dried herbs are not accepted.

**Section 2 – FLOWERS**

Each 4-Her may enter a total of six (6) items with no more than two (2) per class. Each specimen must be of a different species.

Class 1450 Annual, 1 best cut specimen

Class 1451 Perennial, 1 best cut specimen

Class 1452 Fresh Arrangement, specify use

Class 1453 Potted Plant or Flower (not eligible for the Kansas State Fair)

Class 1454 Terrarium (not eligible for the Kansas State Fair)

Class 1455 Dried Flower Arrangement ( no fabric or plastic material allowed)

**Section 3– HORTICULTURE NOTEBOOK**

Class 1460 Notebook

Entry shall consist of a notebook or 3-ring binder of written narrative describing a horticulture project such as a landscape design, landscape installation, lawn renovation, water garden, flower garden, vegetable garden, lawn mowing service, landscape maintenance business, farmer's market business or other horticultural project. 4-Hers are encouraged to include photographs, illustrations and/or landscape drawing that help explain work done by the member. Photos taken from the same location before, during and after the completion of the project are particularly helpful.
