Member may make only one entry in this department. Exhibits are open to educational or creative displays. Select durable materials that will withstand fair conditions. The exhibit display or poster size must not exceed 36" wide x 24" tall by 3½" deep. Flat poster/foam-core/cardstock board, trifold foam-core/cardboard, or shooting sports exhibit cases are all acceptable. No card table exhibits are allowed. Exhibits exceeding the size guidelines will be penalized one ribbon color.

"Live" ammunition containing propellant or explosive powders is prohibited. Artistic substitutes must be used in lieu of power and "live" ammunition. Neither the RCAFA nor the Kansas State University department of 4-H and Youth Development Research and Extension are liable for any loss or damage of any personal property included in display.

Exhibitor name, county/district, age and year in project should be in a prominent location on exhibit. Exhibits will not be accepted if they are related to reloads.

JUDGING CRITERIA

Stopping Power- 15 points - Is the main idea specific? Is the idea presented clearly, simply, forcefully?

Interest & Holding Power- 15 points - Does the exhibit give the observer additional facts in a clear, concise, informative way?

4-H Project Application- 15 points - Is the subject matter an effective showcase?

Mechanical Power- 5 points - Correct letter size, pleasing color combination, appropriate symbols and models?

Personal Growth- 25 points - How much knowledge was gained by exhibitor? Enthusiasm shown?

Educational Value- 25 points - Knowledge shared?
