## SCOUTS

1. All entries must have an entry tag attached to the exhibit.
2. The entry tag must be marked with the appropriate age/club division letter before the class number: D-Daisy, B-Brownie, W-Webelos, CS-Cub Scout, J-Junior, C-Cadet, S-Senior, BS-Boy Scout, or V-Venturers.
3. Scout members may exhibit two items per class, not to exceed a total of 6 exhibits.
4. Scouts' exhibits must be on display during the entire Fair or exhibitors will not receive their premium.
5. Exhibitors must be from Rush County.
6. Exhibited items must be the result of 2010-2011 work and never been exhibited at the State Fair.
7. Provide recipes for food items.
8. Any baked item must be removed from the pan and placed on a paper plate and covered with a plastic bag.
9. Artwork must be matted and/or framed and have a hanger attached to be displayed.
10. Scout exhibits will be judged on Friday, Aug., 5 at 10:00 a.m.
11. Good sportsmanship shall prevail by Scouts and adults or they will be penalized at the discretion of superintendents, scout leaders, and/or Rush County Fair Board. Complaining to or interfering with a judge or superintendent by an exhibitor, parent, or leaders will disqualify the exhibitor involved.
12. Scout exhibits will be placed in blue, red or white ribbon groups and premiums will be as follows: blue-\$1.50, red-\$1.00, white-\$0.50. No additional premiums given for Champion or Reserve Champion.
13. A Champion and Reserve Champion will be chosen from the blues in each age/club division and in each section.
