From the Rector's Desk....

Deeper Than a Whim:

The Habit of Corporate Worship

After college I worked as a Lay Assistant in a small rural church. Working in a mission congregation and part time for the local newspaper, I learned many things. Some of my best lessons came from Jim and Sally Hudson, the couple from the church who kind of took me under their wing. Jim Hudson, active churchman at Trinity Church and City Editor of the paper, taught that one should always decide on Saturday night whether to go to church, never upon waking, Sunday morning. He would say that unless you determined the night before not to attend, then just shower, dress and go. Such a personal rule keeps us from going based on the whim of how tired we feel or how interested we feel. Going to church on Sunday morning, in his thinking, is the automatic default mode. Call it a discipline or a privilege, weekly participation in corporate worship, in essence, is a habit. Habits are formed by will and action. Even before the Nike company captured the phrase, when a thing is important, we just do it.

Another important friend in my past was from a small East Texas town. Father Blankenship (who was called Father B by all) was a classic, high-church, bachelor priest, and very much beloved. He was the interim priest before I came and assisted me throughout my time there. He was insistent on church attendance in a strict "old-school" way. Fr. B would say, there are three legitimate reasons to miss church: 1. Illness prevents you from leaving the house, 2. An act of charity to another in extreme need prevents your attendance, or 3. you have passed on to your eternal reward, and are worshipping God from heaven. It comes down to this: God does not have a take-it-or-leave-it disposition with you. We should not have a take-it-or-leave-it attitude with God. Church is where we belong.

What is behind the maxims of both Jim Hudson and good ol' Father B, is people's importance to God. You are important God and to the community of faith. The Sunday service is not the same without you, so it is important for you to take your place in the midst of the faithful, and to offer yourself as a living sacrifice before the altar. From there the God of Love will "Strengthen for service the hands that holy things have taken." You bless others when you are there. You bless God, by your prayers and thanksgiving. Think of the Psalm that says, "Bless the Lord O my soul, and all that is within me bless God's Holy Name." Blessing God and others is the central matter, and secondary to that, we just might get something out of going too: the joy of music, the privilege of prayer, the pleasure of conversation with friends. No, we don't decide on a whim to go to church. It is a habit to sharpen and to live by.

II. THE HOLY COMMUNION

THE OFFERTORY SENTENCE

The part of the Eucharist specifically called The Holy Communion begins with the offertory sentence which reminds us that all we have is God's gift and that we are offering his gifts back to him. There are four parts to this section: 1. Taking of bread and wine, 2. Giving thanks and the consecration of the bread and the wine, 3. the breaking of the bread, and 4. Receiving communion.

In the early days of the Church, worshipers brought their own bread and wine to the service. The deacons chose what was needed for the consecration, and the rest was set aside for the poor. Today we usually have lay persons who bring the bread and the wine to the altar. These may be either people or the congregations or acolytes in the sanctuary. The bread and the wine along with money collected and in some cases groceries for the poor, are the offerings that will be presented to God.

The gifts presented are called **OBLATIONS**. Bread, wine and money offered at the Altar represent our lives, our work, our recreations, our families and our community. In other words, we offer to God all that we have and all that we do. This act of oblation is a key element to our understanding of Christian stewardship.

THE OFFERTORY

The minister of the altar, a priest or a deacon, "sets the table" by laying first a corporal, a white linen cloth, on which are placed a chalice (a cup for the wine) and a paten (a plate for the bread). The purpose of the corporal is to hold any crumbs which may come from the bread. Next, wine is poured into the chalice and a little water is added. This reminds us the blood and the water that appeared when Jesus' side was pierced by a spear at the crucifixion. Tradition says that the wine and water together represent both the humanity and the divinity of Jesus, that he is both Man and God., and that we are called to share with him in his risen life.

Before the Eucharist begins, an acolyte pours a little water over the priest's fingers. This reminds us that we should all come to God's altar with clean hands and pure hearts. It has long been the custom for the head of the Jewish household to wash his hands in a similar way before the prayers at the Passover meal. Jesus probably did this at the Last Supper.

The Holy Table or Altar having been prepared, the Eucharist continues with The introduction to the Great Thanksgiving, "Lift up your heart"—the *Sursum Corda*. This is followed by the *Sanctus*, the ancient hymn: "Holy, Holy, Holy," and the *Benedictus*—"Blessed is he who comes in the Name of the Lord..." In the whole action of Communion, Christ is made known to us in the "breaking of the bread".

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING: THE PRAYER OF CONSECRATION

This prayer reminds us of God's love for us, that we turned away from him, and that he sent his Son, Jesus Christ to share our human nature and to live and die as one of us, so that we might be brought back to God. We are also told of Christ's death on the cross, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world, and we are reminded of the Last Supper and the words Jesus spoke over the bread and the wine. Finally, we ask for the gift of God's Holy Spirit and that we might faithfully receive the precious gift of Christ's Body and Blood in the form of Bread and Wine.

In a very real way, the Holy Eucharist is a drama. It reenacts the offering of Christ and makes it real in our lives. Whether we "feel" Christ's presence or not, He is with us, according to his promise.

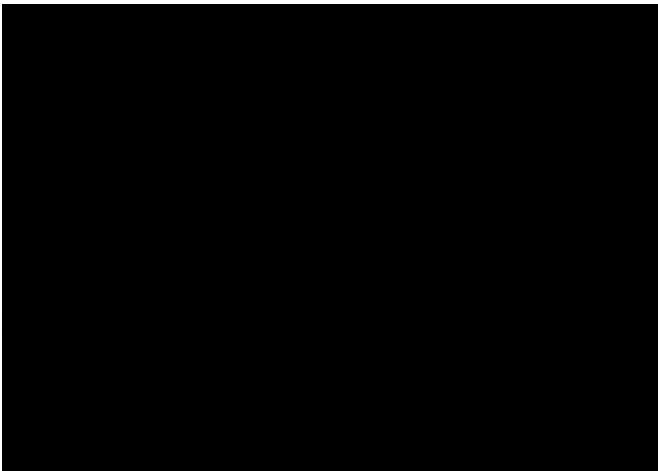
THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD: THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE ELEMENTS

At the first Eucharist, in rites of the early Church, and in our liturgy, the bread is broken and the wine poured out so the elements can be distributed for Communion. For many this breaking of the bread has a special meaning: it has become a reminder of the breaking of our Lord's Body on the Cross. To symbolize this the celebrants break the bread saying "Alleluia, Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us".. to which the people respond "Therefore, let us keep the feast, Alleluia." The gifts we presented to God in the offertory are now being returned to us. Because God has accepted them, they are changed. They have become the spiritual Body and Blood of Christ. Through them we receive God's Power, Love, and Strength....his very life.

Grace Episcopal Church Vestry Meeting Minutes**July 19, 2011**

The meeting was called to order at 7:02 PM. Members present were: Glennie Hefner, Senior Warden, Lynne Bruner, Rod Dockal, Tommy Peebles, and Donna Tate. Meeting facilitator, David Price, Rector, opened with a short devotional. Peebles moved to accept the June, 2011 minutes with noted corrections. The motion was seconded by Bruner. Motion carried.

REPORTS:

Treasurer's report for June 2011 was presented. Brief discussion followed. Peebles moved to accept the treasurer's report subject to audit. Tate seconded. Motion passed.

Wayne Bell, Junior Warden, arrived at 7:10 PM.

Fr. Price presented the rector's report. The average Sunday attendance is 103. Fr. Price presented more information on the diocesan mission work in Alabama doing clean-up after the devastation from tornados recently. Fr. David and a few parishioners are looking into going to Alabama August 7-13, 2011. The expenses of the trip would be shared with St. Christopher's Episcopal Church, League City. Fr. David took some time off in July to help Andrew with his upcoming move to San Antonio for college. He will also be out of the office August 23-27, 2011. Plans for moving forward finding a Christian Education Director are still being put together. August Sunday School curriculum will be provided from his Camp Allen materials. The average daily attendance on Sunday is 103. Ryan Perry's contract as youth minister as part of a three church cooperative was extended through December, 2011, in order to align it to the calendar and fiscal years. He is working to move forward with Perry for 2012. Vacation Bible School (VBS) was not as successful this year as in past. There were only 3 volunteers from Grace. First Christian Church hosted with the program, which was also attended by First Presbyterian Church.

The Senior Warden's report was presented by Hefner. The 9/11 Memorial Service planning is moving forward. The committee met with the Boy Scouts representative as their annual flag-burning ceremony will be part of the service. The next meeting will be August 2, 2011, at 6:45 PM.

Bell presented the Junior Warden's report. Dockal and Bell have made repairs to the fountain in the courtyard; most of the gutters have been cleaned by Charles Lamb and Bell; the lights on the flagpole are undergoing repair and should be finished within the next few weeks; the sprinklers have been retimed and reoriented. Dockal added that there are several rooms with inadequate or no air return and will be looking at corrections to this problem.

Peebles added a report on the upcoming Church Breakfast which is being held July 31 to mark the 50th anniversary of the church building. There will be memorabilia on display and numerous current and former church members with connections to when the building opened have been contacted. Peebles will be speaking at both church services, as well as at the breakfast event between the services.

OPEN ISSUES:

The sidewalk committee has met and Bergmann has drafted a schematic of the proposed sidewalks. Two bids for the construction of these sidewalks will be sought. The companies will also be asked to submit bids for sidewalk repairs separately.

Newcomer's Ministry preparations continue to move forward. Mary Smith has been working with Hefner on these plans. Discussion followed on proposals presented as a result of Smith's research. Bell moved to support the proposals by funding visitor bags and authorizing Smith and Hefner to move forward in writing a grant request from the diocesan Strategic Mission Grants. Peebles seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

Rally Day was discussed. Calendar dates were discussed. As the children will be in Sunday School in August, adults will have a Ministry Fair on August 28, 2011. Also, the children will be registered for Sunday School on this date. Vestry members will be contacting ministry leads sharing Ministry Fair information, and an article will be submitted to The Outpost.

NEW BUSINESS:

Peebles suggested that a church float be prepared for the Alvin Hometown Festival parade September 3, 2011. An alternate entry of a pickup truck with a few children and parents in the bed, and with the church banner carried in front was suggested. Volunteers will be sought for this.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

There was no unfinished business.

The next meeting was set for August 16, 2011, at 7:00 PM

Peebles moved to adjourn, with a second by Tate. Motion passed. Meeting adjourned with prayer at 8:30 PM.
