THE COMMUNION OF THE PEOPLE

The gifts we gave at the offertory, the bread and the wine, are now returned to us. But because God has accepted them and used them for this purpose, they are changed. They are now for us the Body and Blood of Christ...his Power, Love, and his Strength.

Instructions for receiving communion are printed in the service leaflet, but let me remind you again how to receive the Bread and the Wine. For the bread, place your right hand over your left and hold them up chest high so that the priest can easily place the bread on the palm of your hand. You may then consume it or leave it to dip or intinct it into the wine and then place it in your mouth.. If you wish to receive the chalice, please guide it to your lips. If you do not wish to receive the wine, cross your arms over your chest and the chalice bearer will pass by. After you have received the Bread and the Wine, it is appropriate to say “AMEN”.

As soon as everyone has received Communion, the Bread and Wine the chalice and paten are cleaned and put away according to the custom of the church. Some of the consecrated Bread and Wine may be reserved for the sick and those who are unable to come to church. It is kept in the Aumbry — the cabinet over which the sanctuary light burns—symbolic of the Presence of the Risen Lord.

At the principal services on Sunday morning, Lay Eucharistic Visitors come forward to take the Consecrated Bread to the sick and shut-in members of our church congregation so they might share with us in Holy Communion. In other words, since they cannot come to Church, we take Church to them.

It is almost time for us to go, but we should not leave before we say together the prayer of thanksgiving. After this, the priest will give us God’s blessing.

THE PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

We now prepare to leave the church. The procession leads us out into the world around us so that we may do the work that God has called us to do...wherever we may be: in our homes, in our schools, in our work, and in our play. We have been fed with spiritual Food. God has given us the strength to live our lives as faithful followers of Christ our Lord.

Finally the Deacon will send us forth to do the work that God has called us to do, and we all respond by saying: “Thanks be to God”.

We have concluded the Eucharist where we began, in the midst of life, in a world where there is suffering and need. But we are centered, as Christ was, in a life to be lived and shared. The Eucharist is the work of the people of God together. It is not a service confined to Sunday morning. Rather, it is a way of life. It is the essence of life itself.

September 11th Commemoration Press Release

On September 11, 2011, Grace Episcopal Church in Alvin is hosting a special Day of Remembrance in reverent commemoration of our people so impacted by the tragic events ten years ago. For this significant anniversary, the community will gather for an open, city-wide observance honoring the courageous men and women of our first responder agencies, and our military. All will take place at the pavilion-ion and green space on the corner of Hood and Lang streets.

There will be several military and emergency vehicles on display, which children can see up close: a great opportunity for photographs. There will be special music for the occasion by several artists from our area. Children and adults may enjoy a story-time from special works on the topic, and other events incorporated throughout the day.

The occasion will include a writing and art contest for all ages, with a few of the winners reading or displaying their work that afternoon. The contest is open to the public and information can be found on the website: www.gracechurchalvin.com.

The special recognition of first responders and people who have served or are serving in the Armed forces begins at 11:00 a.m., when the Boy Scout Troop 400 will commence their Annual Flag Retirement Ceremony, an impressive solemn ceremony. All our citizens are invited to bring United

States flags that are worn and ready to retire. You may bring them to the church office any weekday morning between now and that weekend.

Prior to the events described, there will be a special worship service 8:59 a.m. (the time at which the first tower of the World Trade Center in Manhattan fell.) All are most welcome to come participate in this service, a memorial to those who were lost that day in 2001, and a tribute to those who serve selflessly and courageously for the wellbeing of others. It will be a remembrance centered on gratitude and encouragement, with special prayers, and glorious music.

The Cross

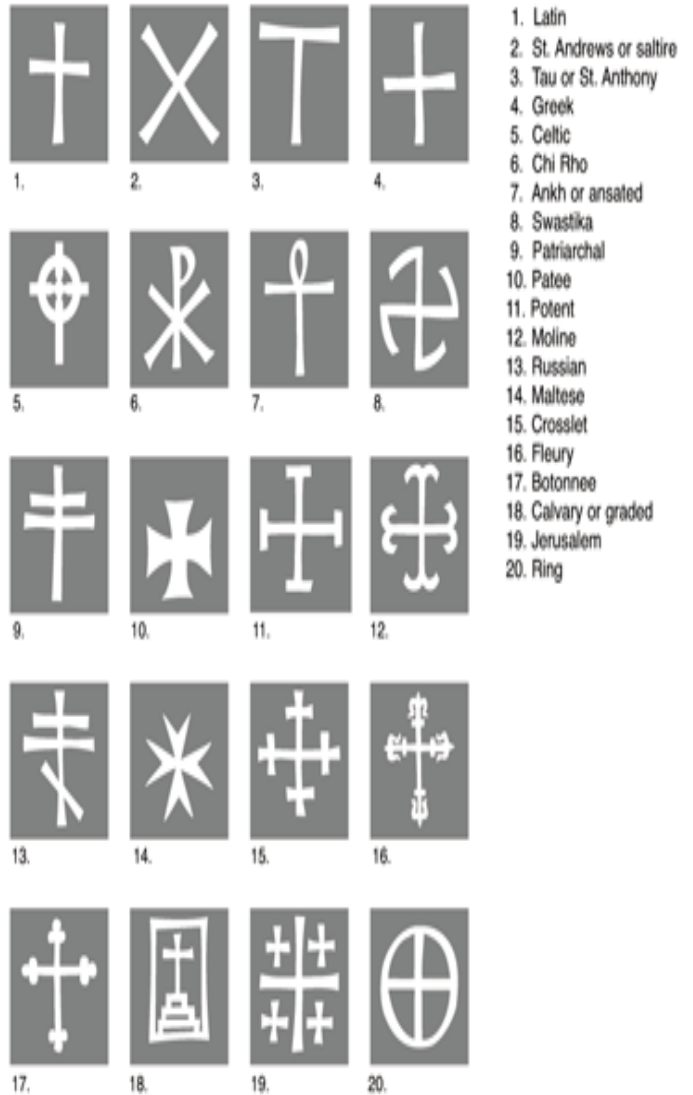
The cross on which Jesus our Lord and Savior died for our sins is the most commonly recognized and most universally accepted symbol for Christianity the world over. It symbolizes God’s great sacrifice, and offer of salvation to all of humanity and the promise of the resurrection.

There are three different styles of crosses Jesus might have died upon. Scholars are not completely sure as to which style it was. The first style is the Tau cross. It is in the shape of a “T”. The second style is referred to as the Latin Cross. The second style is referred to as the Latin cross today and most likely the form Jesus died upon. The final style if he Y-shaped cross. This cross is not as popular as the first two, but still an option.

During the early days of the church, the cross as a Christian symbol was rarely used. Believers did not want to think about their Savior’s death. It was, after all, the instrument upon which He died.

Crosses fall into two major categories: the Greek (equal length arms) or Latin (shorter cross bar raised above the center). All crosses are variants of these two forms and quite a few variations there are indeed. F.R. Webber estimates there are 500 different forms of the cross, with 50 of them playing a prominent part in the decoration of our churches and parishes.

VESTRY MEETING MINUTES - AUGUST 16, 2011

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 P.M. Members present were: Glennie Hefner, Sr. Warden, Wayne Bell, Jr. Warden, Lynne Bruner, Margaret Barrier, Rod Dockal, John Bergmann and Mark Patterson. Meeting facilitator, David Price, Rector, opened with a prayer.

Bruner moved to accept the July, 2011 minutes. The motion was seconded by Patterson. Motion carried.

Treasurer's report for July, 2011 was presented. Brief discussion followed. Bruner moved to accept the treasurer's report subject to audit. Patterson seconded. Motion passed.

Fr Price presented the rector's report. The average Sunday attendance is 101. Fr. Price reported that he, Rod Dockal and Charles Lamb had a great experience on the trip to Alabama to help with clean up after the devastating tornadoes. Fr. Price and Rod reported that the destruction was massive and the progress on the rebuilding has been slow – there is still a lot of work to be done but they were able to help the crew they were working with make real progress while they were there.

Glennie presented the senior wardens report – she displayed a logo that she had commissioned. John Bergmann had taken a picture of the stained glass window above the altar and her daughter in law had adapted that into the logo.

Wayne Bell presented the junior wardens report – no real issues to report. Rod is going to replace the latch on the alter rail. There were some bats seen under the playground canopy but they were able to get free before anyone could get to the Church to look into it. There was a discussion about making sure we watch to make sure we don't see additional signs of bats.

Fr. Price presented a report on youth ministry. Youth will resume meeting every Wednesday night and an additional special event once a month. It was also reported that First Presbyterian Church was pulling out of their contract with the youth co-op. They sent a formal letter giving their 30 day notice and intent to pay thru the end of September. There is a program balance owned by all 3 churches that is in dispute. They assured Ryan and Fr. Price that the reason was financial not anything to do with the program. The cost to continue the program thru the end of December will be approx \$2300. If they cannot find a replacement church for next year – the cost of the program would increase by approx. \$8100.

There were several written reports provided including Pumpkin Patch.

There was a discussion about the upcoming Ministry Fair.

The first bid for the sidewalks was in. Ikon Environmental Solutions has presented a bid of approx \$6490 for the interior sidewalks to the playground and pavilion. They also gave a bid of \$6.87 per foot to replace existing sidewalks along the perimeter. The bids include rebar which may have resulted in a higher price. There was a discussion about if rebar was required by the city for interior sidewalks. Bell agreed to ask the city and get back to Hefner so the bid could be revised. There will also be a 2nd bid obtained as soon as we can confirm the requirements. Bell and Patterson reported that the city may consider sharing the cost of the perimeter sidewalks but that it would have to be included in the 2012 budget so the discussion on these sidewalks will be tabled until we get an answer from the city. We will continue working on obtaining bids on the interior sidewalks only.

There was an update presented by Hefner on the plans for the 911 Commemoration. Date for the next meeting of the 911 Committee was set for September 1st at 6:45 pm, and there will be signup sheets available at the Ministry Fair.

Under New Business Hefner reported that Leah Jones had agreed to chair Stewardship for this year. Stewardship was to kick off on 8/26 with a Wine & Cheese Reception where they would ask members to be table sponsors for a Stewardship Dinner on 9/24. Table Sponsors would be responsible for inviting members to the dinner and decorating their table and providing place settings for 8. The goal is to have the majority of our pledges turned in by that date. The dinner is so we can celebrate all the gifts our members bring to Grace thru time and treasurer, as well as to provide the opportunity for members that may have never pledged to become involved in the process. All members are to be invited to the dinner whether they have pledged or not.

The Vestry appointed the following parishioners to the Nominating Committee for Vestry and Council: Lynn Bruner, Margaret Barrier. John Bergmann agreed to ask either Jane Hoffman or Phyllis Wall if they would serve and the Vestry approved either one should they agree.

Hefner reminder the Vestry that we had the Ministry Appreciation Banquet coming up in November and asked that everyone make sure their ministry lists are updated to include all current ministry leaders.

The next meeting was set for September 20th.

Bruner motioned for adjournment and Bell seconded and the motion passed at 8:30.
