From the Rector's Desk....

Pulling Together

As the month of June opens we have just enjoyed the Parish Picnic and our celebration of 114 years of mission as Grace Episcopal Church Alvin. We made a kind of homecoming theme of this special Day of Pentecost. The Pentecost event of the disciples, recorded in the Acts of the Apostles, was a day when the followers of Jesus gathered together as our Lord told them to do. They were clothed with power from on high. It was a family reunion after having been scattered. As an intact family, the Holy Spirit empowered them for ministry in the world. In some sense, the church was born that day; the Body of Christ was formed and given life by Christ, Head of the Body.

We prepare ourselves for a renewal of that empowerment. To fulfill our ministry to bring the love of God to people in our area, we need the Holy Spirit to pull us together, that we may build one another up, and be sent to represent Christ wherever we go.

The Sunday after Pentecost, Trinity Sunday drives home the same message: just as in the Trinity all three Divine Persons hold together in perfect harmony, with none being before or after the other, so God intends for the church. We are moved by God to be in harmony as a cohesive unity in our mission to proclaim the love of God.

This month, in our Sunday liturgy, we will celebrate the impact of God in our lives. We hope to hear from fellow parishioners about the difference God makes in their lives. Alongside the sermon, I will be looking for fellow parishioners to share a little from their own experience about the inspiration that Christ is to them. We have two crosses, besides the main altar cross at Grace, and we will send these crosses home with individuals or families to be a symbol and focal point in their home, the week before they share in the liturgy.

The lessons are rich in June for some wonderful themes. Jesus raises the son of the widow of Nain, and shows us that his power to give life is available to us now, and ensures eternal life. The woman anoints the feet of Jesus and models for us the beauty of humility and reverent devotion. The healing of the Gerasene demoniac shows the power of God for liberation and deliverance for destructive powers.

Make June a month when you dedicate yourself to come together in Church on Sunday. It makes a difference not only to you when you come, but a difference to all who are there. Church is not quite the same without you present. We come to church for God and for no one else, we come to offer praise and thanksgiving, but it blesses everyone else as well. God is pulling us together, and will empower us for wonderful ministry.

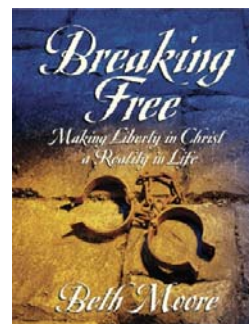

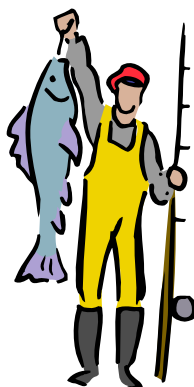
In June, the Outreach Committee and

Youth Broomball was a big success! The turnout was good and lots of fun was had by all. Look for more exciting outings in next month's Outpost!

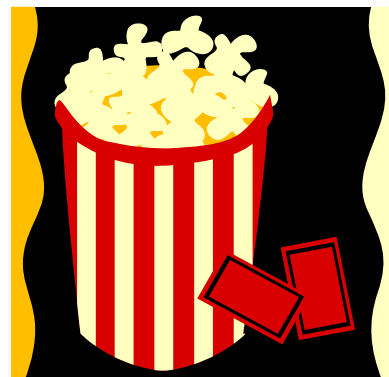
....Now Showing...

Guests Welcome, Members Expected

I saw this headline on a church billboard of another church in Alvin. At first I was like wow, that is very straightforward and could offend some people. Then I thought what does it mean to me personally? When I started attending Grace I was not sure it was the church for me, or more importantly, my family. My oldest child was about 18 months old and I desperately wanted a church he could grow up in and feel God's love. I also wanted a church that would support my husband and me in our quest to establish a stronger relationship with Christ.

Eventually we were overcome by the love and people at Grace and have enjoyed every minute of our journey here. I know I AM A MEMBER. What does it mean to be a member of a church? For me, there are some key points: attend church on a regular basis, make sure my children are involved in church activities, volunteer my time when I am needed, and tithe. What does being a church member mean to you? Have you ever thought about it? The church contributes so much to my life and I feel a sense of pride when I give back to the Lord.
The MOST basic way I can give

back to the Lord is to be in his house of worship every Sunday. 2 Kings 17:36 (New International Version)

But the LORD, who brought you up out of Egypt with mighty power and outstretched arm, is the one you must worship. To him you shall bow down and to him offer sacrifices.

How much of a sacrifice is attending church? Typically, church attendance is down in the summer due to vacations, etc. As I researched scripture for this article I was struck by the thought that not only were people persecuted in biblical times for wanting to worship the Lord, there are still many societies today that do not permit people religious freedom. I am reminded to be grateful that I have the option to attend church and no one can take that away from me BUT me.

Next Sunday, what will keep you away from church? A late night? A pile of laundry? Work project? I ask you to prayerfully consider this gift that you have and sacrifice for the Lord and attend church. The message you may receive may grant you comfort, courage or hope that

you need to get through the next week or a trial in your life.

Vestry Summary

April 20, 2010

Present: Glennie Hefner, Donna Tate, Terrie Beasley, Wayne Bell, Vicki Ennis, and Fr. David. Thomas Peebles, who had a previous engagement, was present for the last 15 minutes of the meeting.

The meeting was opened at 7:10 by Fr. David with a devotional appropriate to the Easter season and with a prayer.

Vicki moved that the minutes from 3 (1 regular, 2 specially-called) meetings be accepted; Wayne seconded. Discussion followed concerning the procurement of bids for additional restrooms. It was explained that a vision committee, to be established, would bring that and other information to the vestry. The motion to accept the minutes was passed.

Reports:

Fr. David said attendance is still down, but, bolstered by Easter, we are currently showing an average Sunday attendance of 108 for the year. Discussion followed on what the problem might be and solutions. A Return to Church Reunion campaign was suggested and will be our Pentecost theme. On Pentecost Sunday, May 23, we will enjoy a single service at 9:30, followed by a picnic. A newsletter article will emphasize the theme and the day's particulars. Donna will do the article. Terrie suggested arriving early for our next vestry meeting and calling parishioners with the information in hopes the personal contact will bring members/attendees back to church. Lynne had previously suggested this and, once again, the idea was well-received. For maximum calling effectiveness, the next vestry meeting was moved to May 11th. Every vestry member is expected to take a list to call (either before or shortly after the vestry meeting). To this end, Glennie will divide our membership/attendee roster into 9 equal parts and e-mail the lists to each member. Cards to those on vestry members' lists were also encouraged.

The pictorial directory was discussed. Many people have signed-up for pictures, with sittings beginning Thursday, 4/22. Terrie suggested that information on Pentecost activities and the fish fry be given to all those coming for sittings. We have business cards, which may be located for that purpose.

Fr. David also reported good news: his Inquirers' Class is large. He also reported that he will serve a week at Camp Allen as Chaplain again this year. He will endeavor to get a supply priest for the Sunday he will be gone, May 2. He also reported that he and the Deacons are attempting to revitalize the Helping Hands ministry. Finally, he reported that our gift of the van to Family Promise will be finalized this week.

The financial statements were distributed and discussed. Like attendance, giving is down. The financials were accepted, subject to audit, on a motion by Vicki, seconded by Terrie. The motion passed.

Janessa, our Youth Minister, submitted no report. But both Fr. David and Terrie reported that the first meeting of the multi-church youth group was a success. Glennie had no report. Wayne had no report, except to say that the leak in the bathroom outside the parlor was not really a leak, but a hose that he reinserted in its tubing.

Open Issues:

The pavilion project has new prices, which are slightly higher than those originally submitted to us. Fr. David will present the project to the diocesan office for its approval and will simultaneously get dates from our contractor so we can get on the agenda of the city's planning commission as soon as possible. After diocesan and planning commission approval, the project still must go before and be approved by city council. Information on the pavilion project will be put in the Outpost. The committee to oversee construction of the pavilion will be Wayne Bell, Mark Patterson, and Terrie Beasley.

All tickets (500) for the fish fry have been distributed or sold. Wayne M. asked that all vestry members take some position of responsibility, and he gave Glennie a list of suggested assignments, which she shared and to which vestry members present agreed.

New Business:

Terrie presented information on Phone Tree software and we were further informed with a 4 minute video presentation. Initial cost is approximately \$1,600. Software maintenance is \$110 - \$160 per year for updates and tech support. Maintenance is included for the first year in the initial cost. The software and use of such must be acceptable to our parish administrator. On a motion by Thomas and seconded by Glennie, it was moved that the software be appraised by Danny and that he report back to us at our next meeting. The motion passed.

A vision committee was also formed to explore and begin work on church expansion projects, including the addition of more bathrooms. The committee consists of Thomas, Glennie, and Donna. Ron Fuertes and Mark Patterson will be asked to join. The committee needs 1 more 10 o'clock person and 2 more 8 o'clock people. Vestry members will recruit and report back at our next meeting.

The vestry adjourned on a motion by Thomas, seconded by Terrie, followed by a prayer.
