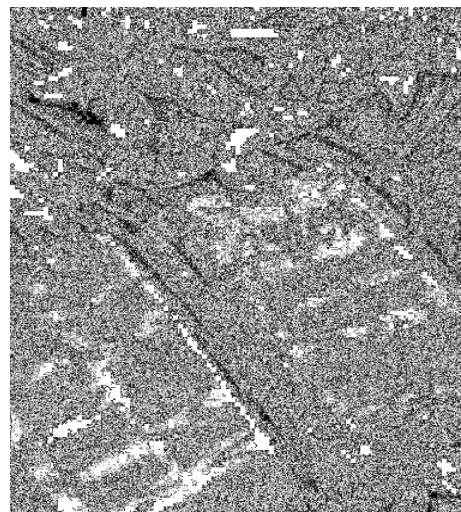
# FIRST NEWS

When I was in junior high, I went through my first "crisis of belief." I had become a Christian at the age of nine and had gone to church my entire life, but I never went through a deep struggle concerning the Christian faith. My struggle was prompted by the following thought: "What happens if when we die, that is it. There is no life after death. We simply cease to be." Before these thoughts came into my mind, I had innocently accepted the reality of going to heaven and that heaven was real. After these thoughts, I would look around and wonder if what was in front of me was all that there was. Maybe it was strange for someone so young to have these thoughts, but they were real and disturbed me greatly.

The place where my questions were answered and fears relieved was in the reality of Jesus' resurrection or, more specifically, in the reaction of his disciples following His resurrection. Think about it. Before Jesus' resurrection, his disciples were hiding and afraid even of the mention of being associated with Him. Three days later, though, they were no longer afraid. They found themselves in prison, beaten by mobs, and all but one died for the faith. What happened to cause such a change? The change was the literal resurrection of Jesus. If the disciples had made up the story of Jesus' resurrection, they would not have been as bold and fearless as they were. After all, who is going to die for a lie that they made up? Therefore, because Jesus' resurrection is real, the greatest fear in life, the fear of death, has been taken up by Jesus and defeated. Life is more than what we see now in front of us. Death is not the end but a beginning. For those who are in Christ Jesus, death is the beginning of eternal, abundant life. In this Easter season, I pray the resurrection of Jesus will become as real to you as it is now to me. Because Jesus rose from the dead, we can live as people with true hope.
